A Short Story of Our Kids' Lit Quiz Teams

Last night two KTS teams of four students competed in the Auckland Regional Kids' Lit Quiz competition held at St Cuthbert's College. The Kids' Lit Quiz is an annual literature quiz for students aged 10–13 years. Teams are asked to answer 100 questions on children's literature divided into ten categories, which vary each year.

Quizzes are held in Australia, Canada, Hong Kong, Indonesia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Singapore, South Africa, United Kingdom and USA. The winning team from each heat competes in a National Final. National

champions compete in the World Final which will be held at St Kentigern's Boys School later this year.

Our two teams performed admirably, coming in 8th (Team 1) and 16th (Team 2) out of a field of 45. Not bad for a boutique Intermediate in Epsom! Congratulations to Team 1: Paige, Elsie, Jesse and Bridget (pictured above left with Lit Quiz legend and Question Master, Wayne Mills) and to Team 2: Lachlan, Charlotte, Kate and Sam (pictured right with our own legendary librarian Jane Russell). PB4L Update

This is the first of our regular updates on our PB4L journey at KTS.

PB4L is a school-wide framework that is helping New Zealand schools build a culture that supports positive behaviour and learning. The KTS team is comprised of staff, students and a parent representative: Alison Spence, Jayne Settle, Felecia Tomich, Jessica Field, Kathleen Mistry (parent) and Jesse (student).

The team has started training sessions to become familiar with the framework and are starting to explore the way that PB4L will fit within our school structures, such as the Kohia Code and the Cornerstones. We just had our second meeting at the Ministry of Education last week, hence the update this week.

The PB4L framework supports the work currently being done by our Staff Collaborative Inquiry (shared professional development by staff) into how we support the wellbeing of KTS students. Some staff members are trialing the use of Circle Time in their classrooms, an approach that prompts the students to collaboratively problem solve issues that arise in the playground.

The PB4L programme takes around 2–5 years to implement, and is tailored to the school culture and environment. For more information visit the website at http://pb4l.tki.org.nz/PB4L-School-Wide


