


Pick 'n Mix

At KTS the Board generally uses this income to staff over our entitlement, which allows us to have smaller class sizes, a sports leader, music and language specialists. The Board also funds a large number of teacher aides to support learning in classrooms.

As a decile 9 school, Kohia Terrace School is provided with low-level government support. The per student targeted funding for Educational Achievement component for a decile 9 school is \$29.22, for a decile 1A school it is \$914.87.
