We are pleased to let you know that School-links has released a free smartphone app called Beep.

This will enable you to:

- · receive news, newsletters, absence notifications and emergency alerts straight to your Smartphone.
- · securely send absence notes to the office
- receive group messages for teams, clubs and special interest groups

To download the FREE app:

Enable push notifications in your settings:Settings > Notifications > Select Beep > Allow Notifications

How much will it cost you?

The Beep app is free and the push notifications to your phone will use only a tiny amount of your mobile data, or you can use your home Wi-Fi network.

You don't have a Smartphone?

The School-links software is very intelligent and those caregivers who have not downloaded Beep will receive emails or SMS text messages instead of the Beep notifications.

The school will continue to send all emergency alerts and absence notifications via email and text, as well as Beep, to ensure that we get critical messages through to caregivers.
