You will still be able to access the junior area using the side gate. We anticipate it will take 3 weeks for the work to be completed. It will be so neat for the students to watch what is going on.

As some of the junior playground is out of action, the Year 2 and 3 students will be able to use the top court.

Kete Cards

The Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) team and the student leaders have been working on how we celebrate and acknowledge the positive choices students are making in the playground. The Kohia Code has been in place in the school for many years but we have now taken it to a new level.

As of yesterday, our Year 6–8 student coaches and the teachers on duty have the following three different cards to acknowledge different behaviour:

Tu pono – displaying respect for self and their own belongings

Examples of this could be:

- Puts polar fleece in bag
- Gets help when they need it
- Puts their lunchbox in their bag

Manaakitanga – displaying respect for others and their belongings

- Helps someone who is hurt
- Picks up someone's polar fleece and returns it
- Helps someone in the classroom with their learning

Kaitiakitanga – displaying respect for the school and the environment

- Picking up other people's rubbish
- Looking after our plants and gardens by not walking through them
- Recycling paper rubbish and feeding the worms with food waste

Each fortnight at assembly the winning class will receive the school kete and the prize box. The winning house will get a spin of the winning house wheel to see how they can celebrate their win on the following Friday. Options for that winning house include a mufti day, their house colour day, time to play with a very special sports box, or bringing their wheels to ride on (bike, scooter, skateboard etc). The winning house will have their new house flag fly with the NZ flag for that fortnight.

As yet we have not heard what the outcome is of the vote around strike action on Wednesday 15th August. I will certainly keep you informed. The decision is whether it is a half or full day so please consider what plans you may need to make. There are some staff who will be working but this will be minimal.
