### Three Way Learning Conferences

Teachers are currently working on assessments to guide the forthcoming progress reports for Year 4–8 students. Teachers of Year 1–3 are preparing some progress and some achievement reports for those students who are currently at a half-year or full-year anniversary for their time at school. For all age groups, these reports will be coming home on Friday 30th June. In the following week, parents and students will have the opportunity to take part in Three Way Learning Conferences (3WLC) with their teachers. Our students are involved in the learning and reporting process, being taught the skills to write success criteria with their teachers, assessing their own learning against these success criteria and then identifying and talking about their next learning steps. They are also able to measure their progress using our learning pathways for maths, reading and writing. These tools, as well as other learning, will be openly discussed at 3WLCs. Your participation in these conferences is valuable to your child and their teacher – it enables everyone involved in the learning to be on the same page, hearing the same message and pursuing the same goals for learning. We look forward to meeting with you and your child.

Attached to this newsletter is some further information about our 3WLCs and guidance to help explain the important role parents play in these learning-focused discussions.
